#### Angela (Angie) McCarty



I was born and raised in Danville, Virginia, where my love for art began at an early age. I was always drawing and painting, and when others recognized my talent, I continued to develop my skills. At 14, I won a regional art contest, and my painting was displayed at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. Throughout my youth, I had a wide range of interests. My Granny often told me, "You can be anything you want—you just have to work for it." I took her words to heart and pursued every passion

that inspired me. At 14, I also discovered my love for aviation during my first flying lesson. Although I studied art in college, I ultimately earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Aerospace Technology. I obtained a Commercial Instrument, Multi-Engine Instrument, and Instrument Instructor Pilot License, along with 13 different ratings. My aviation career began as a flight instructor before transitioning into commercial flying for courier and charter services. Later, I pivoted to hospital administration, overseeing three floors of a hospital as well as its morgue. Inspired by my Granny's belief that I could do anything, I pursued a career in law enforcement, joining the Special Investigation Division (SID) as an undercover narcotics agent. My career then led me to the Virginia Defense Force, where I served as a search and rescue pilot based at Fort Pickett, VA. For nine years, I flew search and rescue missions for natural disasters before retiring from the Defense Force. While in the reserves, I was recalled to active duty after 9/11, stationed again at Fort Pickett. Fortunately, our unit was not deployed for war on U.S. soil.

Despite my diverse career path, I always returned to my love of painting. I have created murals for both individuals and businesses, including one spanning 24 feet tall by 30 feet wide—about the height of your gym wall! Art has always brought me joy, as has my lifelong passion for animals. I got my first horse at age three and continue to love horses today. Traveling is another source of happiness; I have visited over 30 countries across five continents.

My husband and I owned and operated four roller skating rinks in Virginia and North Carolina, employing more than 100 people continuously for over 20 years. Now retired, we enjoy a quieter life. Our daughter, a registered nurse who shares my love for animals, lives nearby. When I travel, she helps care for my ducks, koi fish, and my two beloved dogs, Fiona and Copper.
