I feel incredibly fortunate to have served as the Principal and Teacher at John Fredson School for the past two years. It has been a true joy to work with such wonderful students and staff, and be part of this amazing community. Alaska has held a special place in my heart ever since I worked a summer job at Glacier Bay Lodge. I will never forget the beauty and spirit of this state. I feel truly lucky to have continued my teaching journey in the state I got to call for six years-surrounded by the land and people who make Alaska unlike anywhere else.

Living and working as the Principal/Teacher in Venetie among the Gwich'in people has been one of the greatest honors of my life. The strength, wisdom, and warmth of this community have deeply inspired me. I have learned so much from the traditions, culture, and values shared here, and I will carry that learning with me every day. I am continually grateful to have been welcomed so generously and to be part of such a vibrant place for the last two years.

My journey in education has taken me across six different school districts—four in California and two in Alaska-working in ten schools under the leadership of 16 principals and 8 superintendents over my 39-year teaching career.

I've taught a wide range of grades, from preschool through 6th grade. I spent my first 33 years teaching in California before moving to Alaska, where I worked in Ambler for three years (and adopted my dog, Chewbacca), then in Circle for one year, and now here in Venetie for the past two years (where I adopted Padawan).

I hold a Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction with a focus on Technology. I'm passionate about using technology to inspire lifelong learning. I hope I provided our students with the best tools to succeed in a rapidly changing world. I hope they will continue to have the confidence to bravely accept any challenges technology has to offer. I also hope I have given the proper reading foundation for these little ones who have been with me for the last two years.

As the daughter of a career U.S. Army officer, I grew up in various places including Washington State, Germany, France, Hawaii, North Carolina, California, and Pennsylvania. I also served in the U.S. Army and was stationed in Heidelberg, Germany before beginning my teaching career. But, the memories I've made here in Venetie with all of you have been a gift I will always cherish.

I will be retiring to live close to my son, Patrick in Bellingham, Washington, along with our dogs Chewbacca and Padawan. Thank you for the memories. I will miss you all.
